Miss Anna L. Webb was appointed Superintendent of Schools.

Repairs to school buildings during the year have been light, the largest item being for shingling one side of the roof of the Clarendon Springs school house.

Schools of 32 weeks are being maintained in seven school houses in town.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT.

In submitting this, my third annual report, I am sorry to say that of the seven schools maintained in town during the year, only two have been entirely sat-

isfactory. Three have been fairly good and two have been wholly unsatisfactory. This is owing to the frequent change of teachers and the irregular attendance of the pupils.

In those schools where there has been no change of teachers, and where the teachers have received the co-operation of the parents, the attendance has been regular, the work good and the improvement very noticeable.

Good teachers, alone, cannot make good schools. When the parents come to realize that the success of the school depends almost, if not quite as much, upon them as upon the teacher, and act accordingly, we shall see great improvement in our schools.

I trust that in the coming year our teachers will receive this support from the parents and that better work will be done in some of our schools than has been during the year just passed.
