## CLARENDON IS SUED BY RUTLAND.

The Town of Rutland has heretofore presented a claim to the Overseer of the Poor of \$728.50 for the care, support and burial of one Winslow, which they claim belongs to Clarendon. Upon investigation we have refused to pay said claim, and Rutland has brought suit to recover the same at the coming March term of Court. We are very confident from what we found upon investigation that Rutland cannot sustain her claim in Court, and should advise the town to make a vigorous resistance to the same.

## CLARENDON ENJOINED BY C. C. PIERCE, ESQ.

Upon petition presented to them the Selectmen proceeded to build a fence at the East Clarendon Cemetery, which had been previously located by the lot owners, who had been notified as far as possible to meet for that purpose on a certain day at the said cemetery. The lumber was purchased and delivered on the ground and one-half or more of the posts set when C. C. Pierce, not being satisfied with the location of said fence or the material of which it was being built, or of both, or some other cause to us unknown, caused an injunction to be served upon the town through us as Selectmen to desist from building said fence or even to repair the old fence. Nothing would be granted except to build a fence upon an imaginary line represented by the surveyor on a plan of the cemetery made for the town. After some delays we finally succeeded in obtaining a hearing and the Court so far modified the injunction as to let the Selectmen build the fence where to them seemed best, which we are able to report has been done as was commenced upon the line located by lot owners, but at a large extra expense to the town, for which the petitioner is liable.

Upon investigation we find that in the different cemeteries where there are lots for sale some persons have taken lots and used them and have neglected and refused to pay for the same. Although the Selectmen can proceed against them, yet we think some vote of instructions by the town to future boards of Selectmen would be beneficial.

## U. S. SURPLUS FUND.

The town will probably be called upon the coming year to pay back some portion thereof for re-distribution under the Eleventh Census as required by law.

The Selectmen would say that the appearance in the Report of the School Fund being twice drawn the past year is because of the change in the school law at the last session of the Legislature. It requires no more money than heretofore, but the two divisions within one year would indicate a larger expenditure for schools than has been made.
